

PUBLIC BUILDING MINUTES FOR MAY 29, 2012 MEETING

THE FIRST ISSUE DISCUSSED WAS PLACEMENT OF THE AMBERLEY VILLAGE SIGN

- A motion to place the sign in the flag plaza passed unanimously.

THE SECOND ISSUE DISCUSSED WAS PARKING AT AMBERLEY GREEN

- Chief Wallace presented three sticker designs to be placed on non-resident vehicles to allow non-resident parking at Amberley Green.
- Non-residents must register with the Amberley police.
- Gardeners will be given two free stickers per household – gardeners are to provide the police with a list of all users for their particular plot.
- Fliers will be placed on vehicles parking at Amberley Green advertising the new program.
- The cost per sticker will be \$10.00 each and the current sticker will be good through December 2013. The annual renewal for these stickers will begin on January 01, 2014 at a cost of \$10.00 per car.
- The design of the sticker was the third drawing presented by Chief Wallace with the all green background.

THE THIRD ISSUE DISCUSSED WAS CONSTRUCTION OF THE BRIDGE AT FRENCH PARK

- A trail head for the new Amberley Trail (We THRIVE!) in French Park was discussed that would begin at the Northeast corner of the intersection of Ridge and Section roads to join with the existing deer path on the French Park property and eventually end at the entrance to French Park. June 22, 2012, Eight Israeli Scouts from Netanya, Israel along with a group from The (City of Cincinnati) Mayor's Summer Green Leaf Program will build a 20 foot bridge across a creek as part of the We Thrive grant. The Cincinnati Park Board will be providing the design and materials for construction of the bridge. A proclamation is to be presented by Mayor Byar. Snacks, water, and pizza have been donated.
