The update includes the announcement of a state of emergency proclamation for Amberley Village, which will allow the Village to pursue federal assistance and invoke local ordinances and powers that may be useful during this public health emergency.

The Village will continue to communicate with you on social media, our website and through regular E-News updates. Today, a special edition of our E-News is also being released and includes important information about the extended tax deadline, our Ohio Primary voting, brush collection, ways to contact us and other valuable information to help all of us get through these tough times. As your Village Manager, I want to assure you that between the Hamilton County Emergency Management Agency and Amberley Village, we can respond to any emergency that comes our way. Our ability to shift our Maintenance staff into their firefighting roles enables us to provide greater protection for residents. For this reason, we are asking you to refrain from

putting brush at the street until we have lifted the state of emergency Order.

We have already had to send crews out to remove brush blocking curbside access and fire hydrants, and many residents have felt slighted by missing what they perceived to be brush pickup. Please understand that brush pickup has NOT resumed, and your diligence in this effort is greatly appreciated.

We continue to stress the importance of keeping yourself, your loved ones and our community safe by staying at home. Each one of us can help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and save the lives of those at risk for contracting the virus. Please do your part and stay safe and at home.
